2. Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>We always follow outcome based teaching learning methods for our students in both UG and PG programmes. We stringently conduct PCI and University approved pharmacy programmes. In addition, we identify the curriculum gap (both technical and behavioral) and deliver contents beyond the prescribed curriculum by organizing Guest Lectures, Industrial Visits, MOOCs Courses etc. Director being a member of Board of Studies of University constantly guides University to update the curriculum to meet the requirements of healthcare industries. After lockdown was declared by Govt of India , we have conducted all online classes for both UG and PG students using various online platforms including Impartus, Zoom and Microsoft Teams. All faculty members not only deliver illustrative lectures but also provide learning materials for the students. Recorded lectures were also send to 20% of the students having problems in internet connectivity in rural areas. Question banks were prepared for the students on the basis of past University Question Papers and GPAT Syllabus and distributed to all students through email. 25 faculties developed MOOCs Courses for various subjects of BPHARM starting from 1st year to 4th year and the lectures are telecasted in Swayam Prabha Channel, DISH TV, You tubes etc . Director of this institute is Coordinator of MOOCs Pharmacy Course for Swayam . These courses are now available across the country for Pharmacy Students through DISH TV for students of other institutes too. Assignments were given and examinations in tune with NEP were conducted in online mode . Weekly counseling sessions were conducted by senior faculties and mentors for resolving any academic and non-academic problems faced by students during this pandemic. Mentor Mentee system was very successful for the students. All experiments recommended in PCI syllabus were covered through recorded videos by our own recorded faculties as well as through You tubes etc. Special emphases were given for virtual labs using CD Simulated experiments (both for Professional Communications and Pharmacology). We conducted online Industrial Visit for students in Pharmasynth Laboratories , Dehradun so that all students get an unique opportunity to correlate their learning with industrial exposure. We conducted online Quizzes to improve the awareness of the country for COVID 19 infections which were participated by more than 2500 participants from India and abroad. Several webinars for the students were conducted by the Institute to supplement the major areas like Drug Regulatory Affairs, Antibiotic Resistance, 3D Printing, Personalized Drug Delivery, Entrepreneurship Development etc by inviting experienced speakers from Industries , Hospitals and Academia. Workshops and Training Programmes were also successfully conducted online for students on Soft Skills and Personality Development by Pyramid Finishing School which had successfully fulfilled our dream to get maximum students placed even in this pandemic after eight companies recruited them after conducting online interviews. Smart India Hackathon was conducted in NIET . These efforts were duly recognized as NIET got QS I-Gauge E-lead certification Award for their outstanding contribution in providing quality education. Doubt clearing sessions and actual practical experimentation are now conducted after lockdown</p>
