Why do some people believe in the existence of paranormal energy?

Most people believe in ghosts because of some personal experience that maybe, a family belief in the existence of friendly ghosts in the house or some unnerving experience during a ghost tour or local haunt However, many humans trust that support for the lifestyles of ghosts may be discovered in no less a hard science than modern physics.

It is widely claimed that Albert Einstein suggested a scientific basis for the reality of ghosts, based on the First Law of Thermodynamics: If energy cannot be created or destroyed but only change its form, what happens to our body's energy when we die? Could that somehow be manifested as a ghost?

As the saying goes that half-knowledge is worse than ignorance. Until you dig into the basic physics the above assumption looks appropriate to believe in the existence of unexplained powers. The answer is not at all mysterious, it is very simple. After a person dies, the energy in his or her body goes into the environment. This energy is released in the form of heat, and the body is transferred to the animals that eat us and the plants that absorb us. There is no bodily "energy" that survives death that is detected by popular ghost-hunting devices.

The science behind the existence of the unexplained phenomenon

Scientists and psychologists have already started to look at why some people are still intrigued with the old superstitions and folklore. Their findings may tell some hidden virtues of believing in the paranormal.

We often listen to people saying that ghosts are nothing but the faulty activity of the brain. According to a few reviews invisibly shifting objects are discovered while there is harm in certain regions of the right hemisphere which can be accountable for visual processing; positive sorts of epilepsy(neurological sickness), meanwhile, can cause the spooky feeling that a presence is stalking you nearby – perhaps underlying accounts of faceless "shadow human beings" sneaking within the surrounding. So, hence we can positively say that some fault in the brain can show the existence of ghosts.

But the encounter with ghosts is not always due to a malfunctioning of the brain. Certain visual illusions ought to confound the healthy brain and create legendary beings. His later experiments showed that the illusion is highly common while you take a look at your reflection in the half-light, possibly because the mind struggles to construct the contours of your face, so it begins to fill in the missing information – even supposing that results in the arrival of skulls, old hags or hideous animals.

Failure in finding any scientific evidence about the existence of ghosts

The evidence for ghosts is no better today than it was a century ago. There may be two possible reasons why ghost hunters failed in finding evidence. The first can be that ghosts don't exist and that reports of ghosts can be explained by psychology, misperceptions, mistakes, or hoaxes. The second option can be that ghosts do exist, but that ghost hunters do not possess the scientific tools or mind-set to uncover any meaningful evidence.

But ultimately, ghost hunting is not about the evidence at all (if it was, the search would have been abandoned long ago). Instead, it's about having fun with friends, telling stories, and the enjoyment of pretending to search the edge of the unknown. After all, everyone loves a good ghost story.






