


Plantation Drive

Theme: Plantation Drive

Date: 04th July2020 – 09th July2020

Participants: All members of NIET, Group

Overview:

To encourage people for plantation and support the earth to prevent from global warming and reduce pollution.

With reference to notice issued by AKTU. Lucknow, Notification No: 2020/5506 dated 24th June 2020, NIET Greater Noida participated in plantation drive under Van Mahotsav and became a part in achieving the goal set by UP Government for plantation.

Green Gold club, NIET organized this plantation drive in post pandemic COVID-19 with measuring all precaution of preventing the spread of corona virus. All Teaching and Non-teaching staff of NIET participated in this drive.

STRATEGY:

Our team has decided to achieve the target in phases.

Day-1: To plant 75 Sapling at Plot No 19 Knowledge Park 2 Greater Noida. Day-2: To plant 50 sapling at Plot No 14 Knowledge Park 2 Greater Noida

Day 3: To plant 50 sapling at outside of the campus of plot no 19.

Day 4: To Plant rest sapling at nearby area of Campus.

Supply of Plants:

With the help of Forest Department, Noida we are able to collect plants from “GAMA Nursery”, Greater Noida, the required number of plants in two phase. The plant is being supplied free of cost and permission letter for collecting 200 plants in phase-1 is being attached with it. The permission for phase-2 plantation will be taken in due course of time and will be planted as per scheduled timeline.

1. Oleander (Kaner) – 50 numbers
2. Indian rosewood (Sisham)- 30 numbers
3. Jamun – 30 numbers
4. Guava – 30 numbers
5. Arjun tree – 30 numbers
6. Papli – 30 numbers

A video on Child Labour was also shared to spread awareness about child abuse amongst people.




A video was shared on various methods of self defense that could be used in case of emergency.

The program started with a welcome speech by Dr. Vinod Kapse, Director, NIET, Greater Noida. He stated that NIET always supports female students, faculty & staff. He mentioned that NIET has a separate Women Grievance Redressal Cell for any such issues and Dr Ghazala Naaz is heading the cell. Dr. Kapse also said that time to time such awareness campaigns should be conducted to make people aware.

Guest Speaker: Advocate Seema Durrany, Civil Lawyer, High Court, New Delhi

Moderator of the Session: Ms. Kanika Jindal, Associate Dean, Student Welfare

She enlightened us about Gender inequality and remarked that the need of the hour is to make a change in the mindset of the society and destroy the prejudices that damage the future of the girl child. What is required is a concerted effort to sensitize the society in eradicating this issue of gender inequality. It is high time that every child is treated equally and given every opportunity required to grow to his/her full potential.

IPC

Advocate Seema Durrany pointed out that victims of domestic abuse or domestic violence should talk to family, friends, neighbors or co-workers about the domestic violence they experience. It may be helpful to call a domestic violence helpline for information, referrals and support.

Mrs. Durrany also discussed about various ways to stop dowry system. She mentioned that :

- All the groom needs to take a step up and say, “no to dowry.’
- Education to the daughter
- Bride should say no to greedy grooms
- Social awareness activities

Dowry system is a social stigma that needs an end. Every girl should go to her in-law’s house with pride. There should be more strict rules to end the dowry system. In India, every 5 out of 10 families face the problem of dowry. The youth of this generation, can stop it by not supporting the act. We can make awareness campaigns, and we can end this system.

She has mentioned various laws, acts and sections related to above major three issues. Her talk was highly insightful.




On the auspicious occasion of Navdurga Celebration the students of Department of Biotechnology along with few students of 'Kathputliyan', the theatre club of NIET performed a skit showcasing female foeticide and PCPNDT Act 1994. Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act, 1994 is an Act of the Parliament of India enacted to stop female foeticides and arrest the declining sex ratio in India. The act banned prenatal sex determination. Every genetic counselling centre, genetic laboratory or genetic clinic engaged in counselling or conducting pre-natal diagnostics techniques, like in vitro fertilisation (IVF) with the potential of sex selection (Preimplantation genetic diagnosis) before and after conception comes under preview of the PCPNDT Act and are banned. 


